

CEF Attended the 5th International Yellow River Forum

September 28, 2012

The 5th International Yellow River Forum (IYRF) was held in Zhengzhou, capital city of Henan Province in north-central China from September 24 to 28, 2012, under the theme "ensuring water right of the river's demand and healthy river basin maintenance".

Jun TIAN, person in charge of the Chengdu Pole of the China-Europa Forum (CEF) and Secretary General of the Chengdu Urban Rivers Association (CURA), and Denise LAI, Project Manager of CEF, were invited to attend the meeting.

The five-day water conference included two summit meetings- Water Leader Summit and River Dialogue, and five thematic sessions- Integrated River Basin Management, River Health and Environment, Climate Change and Adaptive Water Management, Tools and Technology, and Water Governance and Stewardship.
